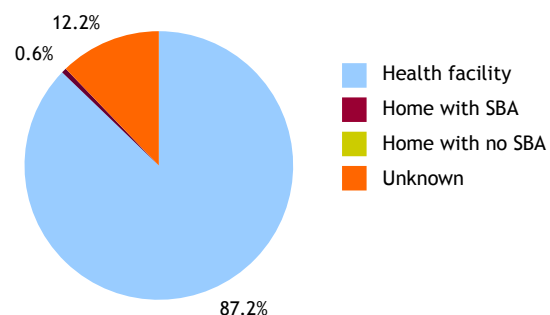

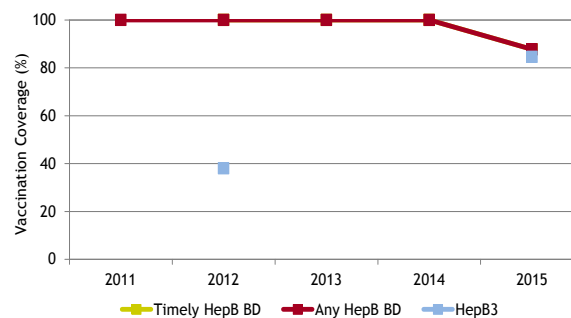

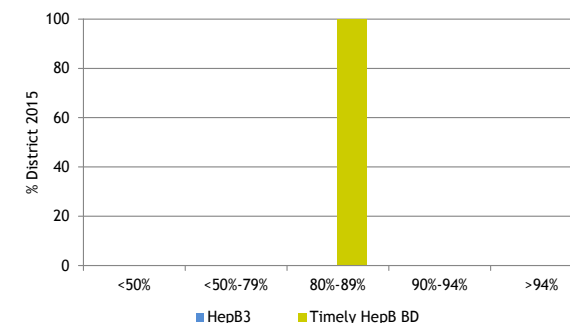
2012 Neonatal deliveries
